In addition, students participate in three group projects, which serve as an introduction to scientific research and writing, culminating in a personal thesis, with the possibility of publication in peer-reviewed journals.

The program also provides opportunities for practical laboratory experience, either through specific laboratory exercises or by choosing an experimental thesis, making it ideal for students wishing to deepen their practical skills in the field of Nanomedicine.

MSc "Nanomedicine" is designed to help students gain the essential knowledge and develop the necessary skills and deep understanding required to thrive and innovate in the ever-evolving landscape of Nanomedicine.

It focuses on areas where the user has the ability to manage, analyse, process, save and display combined levels of information spatially and qualitatively. The Postgraduate Program leads not only to obtain a specialized degree, but also to gain experience and substantial knowledge in matters related to management and spatial analysis of information. The renowned teaching staff, with long experience in Geographic Information Systems and its technological applications, as well as the visiting scientists will make the greatest contribution to the education of students, aspiring to set high goals in the most modern technological and professional challenges.

Objective: The Postgraduate Program (PSP) "Geographic Information Systems" is supported by the Department of Geology and Geoenvironment of NKUA. The subject of "Geographic Information Systems" is the scientific field of Geographical Information Systems with an emphasis on programming tools and databases in a GIS environment, on online tools for commercial applications and research topics, both at an applied and research level, focusing on the field of geoenvironment, geoarchaeology, medicine, finance and marketing. The scope of the postgraduate program is the substantial and targeted offer from the Faculty of Geology & Geoenvironment of the National and Kapodistrian University of Athens, which has extensive experience in managing and presenting information, in relation to their spatial component, as well as the use of the above in research applications. #### Objective:

The Athens MA in Ancient Philosophy aims to offer in-depth knowledge of Ancient Philosophy and high-level research training in its different fields. By the end of their studies, graduates are expected to be able to conduct independent and collaborative research, meeting all requirements for pursuing doctoral studies.

The courses are taught in English.

Description: Program graduates will be especially prepared to contribute critically to issues connected to informatics and telecommunications (e.g. AI, Big Data, Robotics-Automation, the Internet of Things), the pursuit of environmental sustainability (e.g. through appropriate energy and transportation technologies), biology, medicine, biotechnology and biomedicine (e.g. from gene editing, stem cells and biobanking to the study of pandemics). They will be able to identify the best options and make recommendations regarding economic and social policies (e.g. concerning inequality, work, social rights, gender, disability), applied ethics (e.g. ethics of science, technology and medicine, business ethics), innovation, research and development, regulation and the law, and issues of contemporary importance (e.g. science, technology and borders/migration).

Objective: The purpose of the Program is to train graduates who could analyze, interpret, intervene and make recommendations on issues of relevance to science, technology and medicine, based on interdisciplinary perspectives from the human and the social sciences.

### Logic

Description: Logic is the discipline that deals with correct reasoning, that is, the principles and methods of validly inferring conclusions from assumptions, independently of particular contexts of investigation. Having been a branch of philosophy since antiquity, it became a branch of mathematics, too, in the 19<sup>th</sup> century. The graduate programme “Logic” covers both mathematical logic and philosophical logic/philosophy of logic. It extends to the use of logic for providing foundations of mathematics and to the application of logic to central branches of philosophy, such as metaphysics and philosophy of language. It also covers the history of logic. It has three specializations:

- History and Philosophy of Logic (M.A.)
- Logic and Foundations of Mathematics (M.Sc.)
- Mathematical Logic (M.Sc.).

The programme is taught by members of the three cooperating institutions, as well as by distinguished scholars from other Greek or foreign institutions.

Objectives: The programme “Logic” aims to provide in-depth studies and high-level training and specialization of graduate students in the science of logic, as well as in its interaction with mathematics and philosophy, both for the needs of research in that science and for the needs of education and any other area requiring skills of analytical and synthetic thinking.

Language of instruction: English.

Duration of studies: two academic years (four semesters, 120 ECTS).

Period of submitting applications: March to May.

Tuition fees: €750 per semester for students from countries in the European Union and €1500 per semester for those from outside the European Union.

### Data Science and Information Technologies

Description: This Postgraduate Program leads to the awarding of a Postgraduate Diploma (MSc) after the successful completion of studies, based on the curriculum, in two specializations:

1<sup>st</sup> specialization: "Big Data and Artificial Intelligence"

2<sup>nd</sup> specialization: "Bioinformatics - Biomedical Data Science"

Data Science, and particularly the fields of Big Data, Artificial Intelligence and Biomedical Data, on which the MSc focuses, have been evolving rapidly during the past few years. The objective of the MSc programme is to train scientists and researchers of diverse backgrounds who will contribute to the fostering of research and technology in the areas of Data Science and Information Technologies, promote knowledge and address emerging educational and research needs. The MSc in DSIT is by its very nature intensely interdisciplinary.

Objective: The aim of the Postgraduate Program "Data Science and Information Technologies" is to provide high quality postgraduate education in the scientific fields of Informatics, Data Science, Artificial Intelligence, Machine Learning and Bioinformatics.

The courses are taught in English.

#### Environmental Sciences and Public Health

##### Subject – Objective

The purpose of the Master's Program in "Environmental Sciences and Public Health" is twofold. Firstly, it aims to promote scientific knowledge and the application of new knowledge and technology in the context of the new conditions and challenges of climate crisis management in the 21st century. Secondly, it aims to specialize new scientists with a focus on the environment and public health and the ways in which these fields interact, complement, and overlap. The M.Sc. program leads to the award of a Master's degree upon the successful completion of four academic semesters.

The M.Sc. program commences in the winter semester of each academic year.

To obtain the M.Sc. degree, a total of one hundred and twenty (120) credit units (ECTS) are required.

During the course of their studies, postgraduate students are required to attend and successfully complete postgraduate courses, engage in research activities, and write and present scientific papers. Additionally, they are expected to conduct independent research for their Master's thesis.

Teaching is delivered through a combination of in-person classes and distance learning methods, as needed.

- The courses are taught in English.
- Application period: June-September
- Duration of studies: four (4) academic semesters
- Fees:
- 1,500 euros per academic semester (6,000 euros in total) per postgraduate student coming from countries within the European Union (EU)
- 2,500 euros per academic semester (10,000 euros in total) per postgraduate student coming from third countries outside the European Union (EU)

Courses are organized into semesters, following a weekly schedule, and are conducted exclusively in English.

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## School of Law

### [LL.M. in International and European Law](#)

Description: The LLM "International and European Law", taught entirely in English, is an intensive one-year Master's programme which provides students an in-depth theoretical and practical training in Public International Law and European Union Law. The Programme covers a single academic year, in the course of which students must successfully complete two semesters of core, mandatory taught modules while conducting research, under the supervision of our Faculty, leading to an original item of written work in the form of a dissertation. The "LL.M. in International & European Law" offers two specializations: one leads to an LL.M. in International Law and the other to an LL.M. in European Union Law. Each specialisation comprises of core and elective modules, interactive seminars and focus areas, allowing students to tailor their curriculum to their specific areas of interest. For the successful completion of the Programme students must obtain 75 ECTS.

The Programme's objective is to promote knowledge and research in international and European Union law at an international and national level and to develop an understanding of the theory and practice of public international law and European Union law. Holders of the LLM will have acquired a systematic knowledge of specialization, be able to conduct independent research and at the same time possess the necessary skills to practice law.

The courses are taught in English.

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## School of Law

### LL.M in International and European Legal Studies

Description: The LL.M Programme in International and European Legal Studies (IELS) consists of two separate LL.M Courses:

- a) European Private Law and
- b) Private Law and Business Transactions.

It is an intensive Master's Programme which provides its students with an in-depth understanding and a hands on knowledge of European and International Private Law. The IELS students will benefit from the strong network and various activities of the European Law School Network (ELS) and its participating Universities, comprising of the Humboldt Universität in Berlin, King's College, La Sapienza University in Rome, the University of Amsterdam, the Universidade Católica Portuguesa in Lisbon, Paris-Panthéon-Assas Université and Autonomous University of Madrid.

The tuition fees for the LL.M. programme amount to 2.200 € (Euros)

The LL.M. programme in International and European legal studies runs for 12 months (October to September). The taught part of the program takes place during the Winter and Spring semester. During the two semesters, a total of nineteen (19) courses are taught, of which six (6) are defined as core modules and the remaining thirteen (13) as optional modules. The optional modules are common to both specialisations of the Programme. Successful completion of a minimum of four (4) modules is required to complete each semester of study. At least two (2) of these modules are selected from the list of core modules that are compulsory for each specialisation per semester of study, while the remaining two (2) can be freely selected either from the list of core modules for each specialisation per semester of study, or from the list of optional modules per semester of study, which are common to both specialisations.

During the summer period, students shall write a dissertation on a subject of their choice, supervised by a member of staff.

The applications for admissions are open for one month and usually take place in June. The admissions take place in October and the courses start in mid-October.

The objective of the Postgraduate Programme is to train journalists and general experts in the field of Communication, Media, and culture, who will be able to cover cross-border events of refugee/migration flows. In Greece, and in the countries of South-eastern, Central, and Northern Europe, the advent of refugees and migrants causes tensions and conflicts on many levels. The role of the Media is very important in this instant. The situation is aggravated by new media (social media), the role of national and international Non-Governmental Organisations, the multiculturalism of the phenomenon (flows from Syria, Pakistan, Afghanistan, from countries in Asia and Africa etc.) or the political extensions of the phenomenon in the internal life of countries, that require a comprehensive and objective communicational approach and management. Greece, as a country of first entry into Europe and as a passage for refugee flows, and even as a destination country now, has to offer comprehensive, well-rounded, and valid information to the European Citizens, as well as to the citizens of the countries of origin of the refugee flows. The matters that need to be covered are related to the views of the public opinion, the national, European, and international policies for managing the phenomenon, the role of NGOs, as well as the communicational management of these flows by executives that will be working in competent authorities of the public, private and community sectors. The second specialisation will train executives who will work in Newsrooms abroad or in Greece, in public agencies that deal with the issue of the communicational management of refugees/migrants. The third specialisation concerns the training of Cultural Mediators. In all three specialisations there will be close collaboration with international organisations like the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees in Greece and the International Organisation of Migration (UNHCR\_Greece and IOM\_Greece), as well as Non-Governmental Organisations (NGOs) that are active in Greece and Mytilene-Lesbos or other areas in the country. For the third specialisation there will be close collaboration with the NKUA's Foreign Language Teaching Centre. Memoranda of Cooperation have been signed with all the aforementioned entities, defining the cooperation of the DCMS with these entities.

Description: The Joint MSc “Leadership: Ethics and Politics” focuses on Leadership from the perspective of Ethics Philosophy, Political Science, and Legal Studies.
